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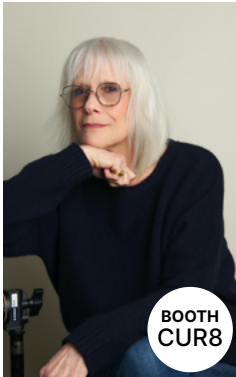


Crevette Design Studio CREVETTE

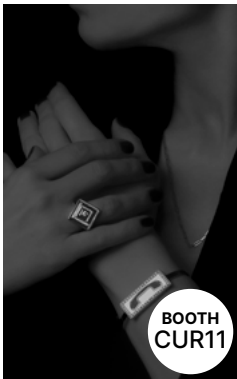
Lindsey L. Allen

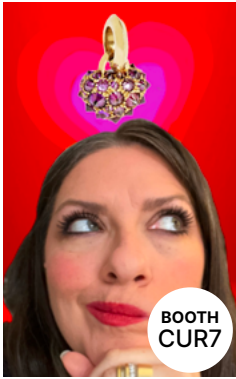
Svetlana Lazar
